Our school wellbeing week kicks off on Monday 8th January. The week will cover five key themes:


- Healthy Eating;

# Blueprint 2020

September 2017/18 sees the fifth year of our dynamic six year school development strategy. This innovative and far ranging plan will bring our school to the next level in terms of learning and services to our community.

In this section we want to share some of our key strategic goals for the year ahead and then focus in on a few of the key innovations. Over the next year we will regularly report on what has been achieved and the new projects that we develop.

#### Strategic Leadership

To share good practice across the school and beyond to enhance staff development and pupils' attainment. This will include the development and coaching of curriculum leaders;

The continued development of Shared Education with St. James's Primary School. In particular, this will allow the schools to promote S.T.E.M. and Forest School learning as well as achieving 'Rights Respecting Schools' status;

To engage with community stakeholders to increase aspirations, attainment, early intervention and collaboration. This will include focused family learning support interventions.

#### Ethos

Implement and review a whole school wellbeing strategy;

Achieve the British Council's International School Award by June 2018;

Use the pursuit of the Eco Green Flag, by June 2019, as a means to educate our school community to be more eco friendly.

#### Learning and Teaching

90+% of pupils, in both, Literacy and Numeracy will achieve as expected or above;

I.C.T. will more effectively enrich creativity, thinking skills and improve school management;

#### December Update

This month, in the midst of all the tinsel and glitter, the School Development Plan was not neglected. Our main area of focus was our **P.D.M.U. Policy and Scheme update**.

The teachers have helped Mrs Clifford (P.D.M.U. Leader) audit our present provision and vision a model for future P.D.M.U. learning across the school. This has resulted in **a new spiral curriculum being developed from Year 1 to Year 7**. On the 5th January staff will use this new document to review and update their half-termly notes for P.D.M.U.

**Family learning** has been another exciting development. We are so proud of the nursery unit's use of the 'Getting Ready to Learn' project to engage and empower parents in their children's learning. The levels of participation and feedback from participants has been very pleasing.

## **Talking Points: Children's Reading**

Every month we would like to share an educational issue with our families. The need for parents and teachers to be on the 'same page' is so important to help our pupils reach their full potential. My hope is that parents would find this information useful and thought provoking. We are also very keen for parents to respond with their comments to us. This month we want to discuss the importance of encouraging pupils to read for pleasure.

As we approach Christmas many parents are searching for those very special last minute gifts. We all look for that gift that keeps on giving. Providing your child with a book that grips their interest is a great option!

Here is some interesting research about the impact of getting children to read more for pleasure. It really is interesting:

Low levels of literacy cost the UK an estimated £81 billion a year!

Incomes are higher in countries with high adult reading ages;

In Northern Ireland the **hourly wage of workers with the highest levels of literacy is 94% higher** than for workers who have the lowest levels of literacy;

Reading for pleasure is a more powerful factor in life than their background;

If your child reads at least 30 minutes a day it is likely to boost reading by one full year;

16 year-olds who choose to read books for pleasure outside of school are **more likely to secure managerial or professional jobs in later life** (the habit has to start now!)

This Christmas our children need toys but do not forget books! We have a fantastic library in school and in the local area. Families can access thousands of great books free of charge!

As you have extra time family time over Christmas and you prepare to go into 2018 consider some strategies to help your family read more:

Have regular bedtime stories (including older pupils too!)

Consider having **family reading times** (read a book together or everyone reads their own book at the same time);

Mums and dads should be reading role models;

Have a weekly library visit;

Start a Family Book Club when everyone talks about the stories they are reading.

Is all of this easy? No, at the start it is hard work and will involve sacrifice. Just like going the gym you have to work really hard to develop better habits. Once you do, however, the results feel and look great. The link between successful readers and adults who reach their life goals is undeniable. This Christmas put improving your family's enjoyment of reading at the top of your list to Santa!

#### 'Operation BLUE'

#### **Anti-Bullying Week**

In November we held our annual anti-bullying week. This year it was entitled **'Operation BLUE'**. Pupils were put into the role of special agents with the mission to identify and address bullying behaviour.

The aim of the week was to **educate** pupils about the nature and types of bullying behaviour. In addition, we sought to **equip** pupils with a 'toolbox' of skills to assess challenging situations and make good decisions. Finally, we wanted to **empower** our pupils as a community to break the silence and never to tolerate bullying.

Each day during the week pupils came to an assembly to learn about bullying types:

Monday - Physical Bullying;

Tuesday - Emotional Bullying;

Wednesday - Social Bullying;

Thursday - Cyber Bullying;

Friday - Racial and Religious Bullying.

They were then sent back to class with a 'mission' to build on the morning's learning.

Pupils were also invited to participate in a house competition to design anti-bullying posters for some precious gold coins.

On the Friday they also completed an end of week audit. The feedback was very pleasing:

**92%** agreed that they understood bullying more clearly (**74.2%** strongly agreed).

Here are some of the pupils' comments about what they learned:

**'I learned that bullying is not your fault**. We need to **break the silence!'** 

'I learned that it doesn't matter where you're from or who you are, we can all be friends. I also learned that if you get bullied you can always tell Julie (school councillor), the teacher, supervisor, Mr Bailie or Miss Watson.'

#### <u>Year 7 Residential Trip</u>

Last week Year 7 had a fantastic time on their residential to Bushmills. On the first day they canoed down the River Bann before relaxing later on with board games and a pool tournament.

On their trip they also visited the Giant's Causeway to learn about the Legend of Finn McCool, orienteered at Downhill, visited the Jet Centre and participated in team challenges such as archery and fire lighting.
