Learning to Live

Blueprint 2020

September 2016/17 sees the fourth year of our dynamic six year school development strategy. This innovative and far ranging plan will bring our school to the next level in terms of learning and services to our community.

In this section we want to share some of our key strategic goals for the year ahead and then focus in on a few of the key innovations. Over the year we will regularly report on what has been achieved and the new projects that we develop.

Strategic Leadership

To share good practice across the school and beyond to enhance staff development and pupils' attainment. This will include the development and coaching of curriculum leaders.

The continued development of Shared Education with St. James's Primary School. In particular, this will allow the schools to promote S.T.E.M. and Forest School learning as well as achieving 'Rights Respecting Schools' status.

To engage with community stakeholders to increase aspirations, attainment, early intervention and collaboration. This will include focused family learning support interventions.

Ethos

Implement and review a whole school wellbeing strategy.

Achieve the British Council's International School Award by June 2018.

Use the pursuit of the Eco Green Flag, by June 2019, as a means to educate our school community to be more eco friendly.

Learning and Teaching

90+% of pupils, in both, Literacy and Numeracy will achieve as expected or above.

I.C.T. will more effectively enrich creativity, thinking skills and improve school management.

September Update

This month the whole school community will engage in Rights Respecting School Award training. This represents the beginning of a year's hard work to achieve this very prestigious school charter mark.

We also met up with the staff from St. James's Primary School to explore how we can share good practice and work together for the advantage of both schools. In particular, we have discussed cooperation in mathematics.

At the end of September we will be having two very valuable training days to explore how iPad technology can be used to develop numeracy skills and creativity. In addition to this we will be investigating new technology options and developing an enhanced e-safety scheme of work.

Shared Education

Whitehouse Primary and St James are delighted to celebrate 25 years working together.

Mr. McConkey and Mr. McKeague (past principals of both schools) in1991/2 started a friendship that has shaped our two schools and the lives of so many children ever since. The relationship grew when our country was emerging from the 'Troubles'. Today our partnership has been recognised across the country and even internationally as a model of excellent practice. Last year our school was visited by a team of E.T.I. inspectors. They were extremely positive about our progress.

How will we celebrate our 25 years together?

We will continue our Shared Education Project. This will involve the following key elements:

S.T.E.M. Workshops - Key Stage 2 pupils from both schools will take part in joint **S**cience, **M**aths, **E**ngineering and **T**echnology modules. Children will complete four or five modules; each lasting seven weeks. These will include for example, robotics and M.A.D. Science lessons.

Nursery and Primary one Outdoor Learning Experience - Nursery pupils from both schools will explore the wonderful outdoors on the grounds of their schools. In small groups they will take part in a whole range of outdoor activities to create, explore and solve problems with their new friends.

This year, work will also begin with the Year 1 children from both Whitehouse and St James's. Parent volunteers will also be encouraged to join us on these sessions and will be trained on how to support children's learning in the outdoors.

Rights Respecting School Award -

Both schools will engage in the 'Rights Respecting School' Award Scheme. We hope to have achieved level one status by the end of the next school year.

These strands will gather momentum over the next three years and we are keen for everyone to get involved. We feel very strongly that Shared Education is a unique opportunity for relationships to be developed between pupils, parents and staff. We believe that the chance to explore and celebrate diversity is a key element of the project and will help our children be leaders in real community change.

In addition,

Year 5 will take part in the Peace Proms;

There will also be a Year 5 Family Residential from the 29th - 31st March 2017;

Finally, there will be a celebration evening when both schools will be presented with a piece of artwork that will be commissioned to mark our 25th Year Anniversary.

We believe that both Mr McConkey and Mr McKeague will be very proud of what their friendship has achieved in 25 very special years.

In Focus: School Development

2016/17 marks the beginning of our new school development plan. Our last development plan brought a number of very pleasing successes.

Here is a summary of our key success in our last three-year plan:

- A new <u>leadership structure has been developed</u>;
- Training was provided for curricular leaders;
- Literacy and numeracy scores increased significantly over the three years;
- Excellent end of Key Stage 2 results put the school <u>well above expected levels</u> for similar schools across Northern Ireland;
- Significant progress was made to <u>improve our use of pupils' test results</u> to inform our teaching and our reporting to parents;
- Accelerated Reading has been successfully introduced in Key Stage 2;
- The development of our new Roald Dahl Library;
- K.S.2 Author Bash Days have been piloted developed;
- Reciprocal Reading researched and training provided for K.S.2 staff;
- Numicon was introduced into Year 1 to Year 4;
- ◆ <u>IzaK9 Mathematical Problem-solving</u> has been introduced into K.S.2.;
- The Nursery has been involved in training to <u>identify</u>, <u>support and track children</u> <u>with additional</u> needs more effectively;
- The Nursery Unit explored outdoor play via Forest Schools;
- New iPads and additional laptops have been introduced across the school;
- ♦ S.T.E.M. workshops piloted in Key Stage 2;
- The school has successfully bid for a £90,000 <u>Shared Education bid</u> with St.
 James's P.S. Over three years to promote S.T.E.M. subjects and better community links;
- An ambitious whole school <u>Wellbeing Three Year Plan</u> was launched;
- Three Anti-Bullying Weeks were developed and piloted;
- The staff have spent time updating the **Behaviour and Anti-Bullying Policies**;
- The 'Order of the Phoenix' house competition launched successfully;
- <u>'New Year, New You'</u> wellbeing community week was piloted and evolved;
- Our new website, app and texting service were introduced;
- New playground routines and equipment were developed.

A few of the more visible developments in **2016/17** will include:

- The school will enhance its I.C.T. provision for pupils and staff;
- Our website will be developed as a resource for learning;
- Our links with St. James's will be extended as we celebrate our 25th anniversary year;
- We will have a Shared Education 25th Anniversary Residential for Year 5 families;
- Forest School learning will be extended into Year 1;
- We will pursue our Green Eco Flag;
- The school will begin the development of an **outdoor learning and play area** for use of our pupils and the wider community;
- The school will achieve the **Level 1 Rights Respecting School Award**;
- The school will continue to promote pupils' wellbeing via its whole school strategy;
- The P.T.A. will encourage community fitness events;
- The **Key Stage 2 pupils will stage a night of dance, drama and music** in June 2017.

As you can see we have a busy year ahead. We need your support if we are to achieve these goals. We are, however, confident that we can reach all these challenging objectives by June 2017.

Our three year plan is very exciting. We are looking forward to helping provide a service to our community that will year on year promote higher standards for all.

TIME FOR ME

School ends on Friday 26th May.


School begins on Wednesday 31st May.
