Blueprint 2020

September 2015/16 sees the third year of our dynamic six year school development strategy. This innovative and far ranging plan will bring our school to the next level in terms of learning and services to our community.

In this section we want to share some of our key strategic goals for the year ahead and then focus in on a few of the key innovations. Over the next year we will regularly report on what has been achieved and the new projects that we develop.

Strategic Leadership

- Introduce 'A Catalyst of Change'. This is a 3 year Shared Education Project which aims to foster outdoor learning, S.T.E.M and community partnership.
- Create a new school development plan for 2016 2019.

Learning & Teaching

- Develop the way we teach and learn phonics, spelling and handwriting.
- Continue to enhance pupils' achievements in mathematics.
- Use our iPads, laptops and computers more effectively to support learning.
- In the Nursery encourage better us of our campus to enrich pupils' learning.

Ethos

- Put our 3 year Wellbeing Plan into practice.
- Encourage the work of our School Council as we work towards a Green Flag.

Campus

Use our website to keep everyone informed about what is happening in school.


September Update:

Already lots has been achieved!

- iPad training completed in August 2015. It was an excellent day!
- Y.5 parents informed about the new S.T.E.M. project.
- Staff are involved in designing seven week S.T.E.M. modules e.g. robotics.
- The nursery staff are developing new strategies for indoor and outdoor play.
- New electronic handwriting scheme in place across the school.
- Accelerated Reading introduced across all of Key Stage 2. A fantastic project that we believe will really enhance pupils' comprehension skills.



'A Catalyst of Change'





We are delighted to inform you that in partnership with St. James's PS our school has received major funding to develop a three year programme to foster S.T.E.M learning and community partnership.

The project has three key strands in Year 1:



S.T.E.M. Workshops

Year 5 pupils from St James's Primary School will travel down by bus every Wednesday afternoon to take part in joint **S**cience, **M**aths, **E**ngineering and **T**echnology seven week module. These will include for example, robotics and M.A.D. Science lessons. Staff from both schools will team teach these sessions. There will also be family science nights, a family residential and a science fair! By the end of three years all K.S.2 pupils from both school will be involved.

Nursery Outdoor Learning Experience

Our Nursery Unit along with St. James's will be visiting in each other's settings and exploring the wonderful outdoors. In small groups they will go with their teacher to the other school and take part in a range of activities to create, explore and solve problems with their new friends. Parent volunteers will be encouraged to join us on these sessions and will be trained on how to support children's learning in the outdoor area. Information regarding these sessions will be available soon from the Nursery teachers.

Rights Respecting School Award

Both schools will engage in the 'Rights Respecting School' Award Scheme. We hope to have achieved level one status by the end of the next school year.

These strands will gather momentum over the next three years and we are keen for everyone to get involved. We feel very strongly that Shared Education is a unique opportunity for relationships to be developed between pupils, parents and staff. We believe that the opportunity to explore and celebrate diversity is a key element of the project and will help our children be leaders in real community change.

In Focus: School Development

2015/16 marks the final year of our present school development. The past two years have brought a number of very pleasing successes. In 2015/16 we are confident that the best of this school development cycle is yet to come!

Here is a summary of our key success in 2014/15:

- Literacy and numeracy scores have increased for the third year in a row.
- Excellent end of Key Stage 2 results that put us <u>well above expected levels</u> for similar schools across Northern Ireland.
- Accelerated Reading has been successfully implemented in Year 5.
- Numicon is now used from Year 1 to Year 4.
- <u>IzaK9 Mathematical Problem-solving</u> has been introduced into K.S.2.
- The Nursery has been involved in training to <u>identify</u>, <u>support and track children</u> <u>with additional</u> needs more effectively.
- The Nursery Unit has been exploring <u>outdoor play via an Erasmus+ project</u>.
- New iPads and laptops have been introduced across the school.
- S.T.E.M. workshops piloted in Year 6 and 7.
- The school has successfully bid for a £90,000 <u>Shared Education bid</u> with St. James's P.S. Over the next three years we will promote S.T.E.M. subjects and promote better community links.
- An ambitious whole school Wellbeing Three Year Plan launched.
- 'Operation Blue' <u>Anti-Bullying Week</u> piloted in November 2014.
- The staff have spent time updating the <u>Behaviour and Anti-Bullying Policy</u>.
- <u>'New Year, New You'</u> Wellbeing community week was piloted in January 2015 across the school.
- We raised £3,000 to build a school for pupils in Cambodia.
- A very successful Summer Fair raised over £2,700!

In 2015/16 we have many ambitious plans. Many of these are listed on 'Blueprint 2020' section of this month's Phoenix. Every month we will keep you up to date with our progress.

A few of the more visible developments in **2015/16** will include:

- Our exciting <u>'Catalyst of Change' S.T.E.M. Project</u>. It will include our nursery pupils exploring the outdoors, all our Year 5 to 7 pupils being involved in exciting S.T.E.M. workshops and the school exploring the 'Rights Respecting School Award'. In addition to this our Year 5 pupils will be developing close friendships with children from St. James's P.S.
- Within Literacy we will be introducing a <u>new handwriting scheme</u> and focusing on how our pupils present their work. We have bought in a new electronic script that can be used to produce worksheets, signs and other material in our school script. This immersion in the new handwriting will make it a natural part of our children's everyday learning.
- We will also revisit our <u>phonics and spelling strategies</u>. Our testing demonstrates that our school is operating above the norm in this area. We want to, however, push for even higher standards.
- In Years 5 to 7 all pupils will use <u>'Accelerated Reading'</u>. The results last year for Year 5 were very pleasing. In 2015/16 we have high hopes for pupils' ability and enjoyment of reading to really increase.
- Our nursery will engage in developing a more <u>creative use of our campus</u>.
 This will include outdoor play and the better use of our building.
- Year 6 pupils will participate in a <u>European numeracy project</u> and use some exciting new engineering software to improve their understanding of mathematics in the real world.
- Our <u>new library will be equipped with new software</u> for pupils to enjoy. It will help them borrow books more effectively and find out more about their favourite authors and books. They can even publish their own writing and reserve their next book from home. After November we hope to have the <u>library open to our families from 2pm to 3.30pm</u> Monday to Wednesday.
- We plan to launch a <u>new house competition</u>. This will help to increase pupils' motivation and increase their sense of school community. We are due to launch the houses in November 2015.
- We are in the process of <u>improving our website</u> to make it more useful and keep in more regularly updated. By January 2016 you should begin to see the improvements starting to be more obvious.
- In the Summer Term we need your help to engage with us as we plan our <u>next</u> <u>three-year S.D.P</u>. Your opinions and ideas will be very much valued. Please get involved!

TIME FOR ME



Time 4 Me is a Barnardo's support service working in schools. It supports children families and schools when life gets tough. Time 4 Me will be in our school every week this year. Our Time 4 Me Counsellor is Julie Magowan and she will be in school every Wednesday morning.

Time 4 Me helps with the things children face growing up which can affect their learning. We support children and families coping with:

- Bereavement
- •Changes in the family (e.g. divorce, illness, conflict)
- Friendship problems
- Bullying
- •Worries about school work or moving to 'big school'


